AWARDS

The Arnold Picker Excellence Award in Journalism, \$350

To a senior for excellence in journalism

Award for Excellence in Investigative Economic Journalism, \$350

To a graduating student who has demonstrated proficiency in investigative journalism in the field of economics. The award is not restricted to journalism students. One criterion is that the be written work is deemed appropriate for publication.

Jerry Bornstein Prize for Journalism Research, \$250

The Jerry Bornstein Prize for Journalism Research is awarded each year to the undergraduate who produces the best research project in or about journalism. The research might be journalism history, media criticism or a journalistic endeavor that includes use of data and other historical materials and a broad range of sources and points of view.

Institutional Investor Award In Journalism, \$250

For one or two undergraduate journalism majors.

Excellence Award in Journalism, \$100

To a top graduating senior for excellence in journalism.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Daniel S. and Florence Roher Scholarship, \$500

To an outstanding undergraduate student majoring in Business Journalism.

Harnisch Foundation Scholarship

For outstanding juniors majoring in journalism who are committed to a career in journalism. Up to \$6,000 per student will be provided to cover tuition, a summer stipend to allow for an internship (up to \$2,000), assistance for technology and travel funds and fees for outside seminars when applicable. The scholarship is renewable in the senior year for students who remain enrolled in the program, committed to a journalism career and maintain a grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or higher.

Institutional Investor Scholarship, \$1,000

For two undergraduate journalism majors who excel in their field.
