She has published numerous articles and books in her field, including *Writing Paris: Urban Topographies of Desire in Contemporary Latin American Fiction* (Albany: SUNY Press, 2002) and *Photography and Writing in Latin America: Double Exposures* (Edited with Mary Beth Tierney-Tello, University of Mexico Press, 2006.)
